Meeting Minutes 12/19/22

Minutes of previous meeting approved and seconded

**Shed Committee:**

Budget remaining for the next 6 months is \$4600.00. We feel it is in our best interest to secure the event tent at Watt Family park but there isn't adequate storage currently. The TLT grant application was rejected because it was not for a permanent structure. Discussion was held regarding a Conex storage container to store event tent and other supplies at Watt Park or an additional storage shed. Liane and David McCall will investigate surplus supplies such as cooking/lighting devices as well as kitchen supplies. Cathy and Liane will price Conex box prices and availability. Cathy shared a spread sheet of inventory at both storage sheds and discrepancies between the two. All boxes were labelled with tape and permanent marker. Desiccants are in place as well as mouse rid. The blanket barrels need to be secured to the walls with plumbers' tape and at that time, inventory will be redistributed to make both sheds more consistent. The city council approved that short term rentals are required to provide 72 hours of emergency food/water for their clients similar to the practices in Wheeler.

Randy Thorpe from Tillamook County Emergency preparedness brought several MREs, multiple boxes of gloves, two Quench Sea SD-50 Saltwater Purification Pumps (see attached instructions), Masks. They will be distributed to the sheds.

**Communication:**

www.BCEV.org web site is up and running, still recruiting photographs of any disaster/planning events. Bay City public notices will add the web site address to upcoming bills. Liane is interviewing with the Headlight Herald and the local radio stations to discuss the things Bay City is doing to promote emergency preparedness in our community. As planned events occur, we will post flyers at the library, post office and city hall and private businesses, as approved.

Mayor McCall stated there is a town hall meeting in March where we could present preparedness information. We discussed creating a trifold poster presentation that could be taken to numerous different events as well as the flyer previously distributed.

There is a potential county wide disaster drill being considered by the Oregon State Dept of Human Services with supplies being purchased for storage at the Air Museum for use by persons living or traveling through Tillamook County.

**Volunteer recruitment:**

Volunteer recruitment needs to be a priority, perhaps a CERT program could be brought to Bay City or Tillamook to support the Fire and Emergency Services. Discussion with other community leaders may help with ideas, Nadona Beach has been working on its own storage shed. Suggestions for a Raffle for a Prepared Go Bag for attendance at an informational meeting could help prompt volunteer and citizen preparedness. Emergency broadcasts are currently active via Tillamook County Emergency Prep office.

Near Space is involved with video recordings using drones to consider water/fire/weather related disasters is another resource to consider for education.
